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**Greetings and Welcome!** We have another great year of Art planned for this year! We'd like to inform you of what students can expect from their Art classes at Anwatin.

## What is "IB"?:

The International Baccalaureate aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect. IB programs encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

## What will students learn?

Students learn through exploring big questions and concepts. For Art, the IB program has identified the following key concepts: Aesthetics, Change, Communication & Identity. To explore these concepts, students will learn about art history, how to talk about art, techniques to create art, and how to reflect upon one's own art. Visual Arts course will introduce students to a range of drawing, painting, printmaking and other traditional techniques used in works of art. Students will broaden their knowledge and understanding of each art form studied, develop their skills into a variety of art techniques, become more creative thinkers, and have the opportunity to respond and reflect on their artistic process.

#### **Assessment:**

Students will be assessed using the IB grading scale (0-8). There are four areas of assessment and each project will provide evidence to show competency in each of these 4 areas:

- A. Knowing and Understanding
- **B.** Developing Skills
- C. Thinking Creatively
- D. Responding to Art

Each objective is weighed equally. That means that each step of the creative process and the work completed therein are worth the same amount. IB looks at levels of achievement in understanding and the students' ability to demonstrate the objectives.
